#### Dismissal

At Newcastle Public School, safety is our utmost concern and we are committed to ensuring every part of our day is as safe as possible. With that in mind, we would like to remind you of a few procedures to ensure dismissal runs as smoothly as possible.

We ask for parent support in the following ways:

- Please continue to send in notes if your child will not be leaving school in their usual manner
- Parents picking up their child early are asked to come to the office and the student will be called out of class at that point. Students will **NOT** be called out of class early to wait in the office in order to maximize instructional time. Parents are welcome to arrive a few minutes early in order to ensure their child is ready on time.
- Please try to avoid last minute phone calls. The office can be quite busy at the end of the day and we cannot always guarantee the message will be relayed in a timely manner.
- Students are **NOT** allowed to get off anywhere other than their regular bus stop. Please do not ask the driver to stop at another stop.

This is a reminder that police checks, including vulnerable sector screenings, must be done annually in order to volunteer on class field trips and volunteer in the school. Please check your expiry date and renew your record check for the new school year.
